Secretary's Report

Treasurers Report

Safety

A couple fliers had problems with poorly connected batteries. This translated into in flight power problems.

Tech Session

The Loc8tor device was discussed. It is a direction finder for lost planes. A small puck (tag) must be installed in the plane and bound to the device. Each pilot would buy his own tag which goes for about \$27. The tag is always listening for the direction finder. When it senses the signal it emits its own which allows loc8tor to hone in on the tag. Ed tested it and it works good for about 400 feet. Not as well when the tag is at ankle level. The device has memory for 4 tags.

* A motion was passed to purchase a club loc8tor (in other words reimburse Ed)

Safety Officer Report

Injury

Jack Buydos was severely injured at the Columbia Club that he fly's at. He has many stitches in his forearm. He started his 50cc plane and forgot to engage the restraint while the throttle was at 1/4. The plane lurched into is arm cutting badly, stopping and breaking the wooden prop. The members of the club called 911 and he was taken to hospital.

LIPO Fires

The NSRCA is reporting multiple cases of LIPO fires. The fires are happening after charging and after the batteries are disconnected after landing. There was suggestion to have an ammo case at the field. The Club is looking for ideas on how to deal with a burning battery. You can dispose of old batteries at Batteries Plus. If a cell starts puffing, get rid of it.

Field Managers Report by Don Grzina

- The Zero Turn belt is here and hanging in the shed. The mower deck has a schematic of how it should be installed. Need a 9/16 wrench to remove a bolt to install the belt.

Complacency, as defined by Webster's is: 'self-satisfaction especially when accompanied by unawareness of actual dangers or deficiencies.' Complacency can be harmful as well as deadly, as an electrical worker complacency is my biggest concern on my job and it prompts me to constantly ask myself "what if?" When we are handling the batteries we should ask ourselves, what if, the battery explodes, are there any other combustible items that could add to the fire? What if, I ignore the warning signs that my battery pack(s) may have a problem? What if....?

Hello fellow flyers, just wanted to share with everyone that I lost my Dad/flying buddy tonight to a lipo battery accident. He had a lipo battery explode and caught his work bench on fire. The fire got out of control and he lost his life. My Dad and I have been involved in R/C for close to twenty years and I am glad to say that I was able to share all the years with him. We started racing cars and in the past three years got heavily involved in flying Airplanes. Dad is retired and enjoyed scratch building planes and boats and would build up to 3 a week. He enjoyed putting them together and having me fly them while he would sit on the park bench with fingers crossed hoping that they would survive the maiden flight. I will miss our time flying together and going to swap meets looking for the good deals. I will miss him with all my heart and I am asking that everyone please buy the lipo sacks and use them for your batteries and I know we all say it won't happen to me but it happened to my dad this afternoon. Follow the charge/discharge instructions and if they start getting puffy dispose of them properly. Now I lost my Dad and Flying Buddy and he will never be replaced.. I am writing this holding back tears with a broken heart and will add more about my dad at another time. I/we lost a great man tonight.

I decided to do a loop while in the process of changing the elevator from low to high rates and apparently stalled causing a beautiful spin, however it plopped into the water right side up (just like the Coota used to do) and I was able to taxi it back to shore. There was no apparent damage and everything was working so I dried out the little bit of water that got inside and flew again on the same battery. After that I flew 4 more flights without any other problems except it seemed kind of low on power requiring almost full throttle to keep airborne. Most of my 3 cell 1300 mah batteries are fairly old and getting a little puffy which may be the reason. There were very few serious mishaps with the other airplanes but several pontoon boat retrievals were required for gas models whose motors quit right after landing. One place where EP's excel!

Dan Sundman and Bill Moran took lots of photos. Bill Moran acted as CD since Don Vetrone didn't arrive until later. Don had several nice flights after arriving. Bill had a new Cub on floats that had not seen before.
